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FOCUSED ENERGY

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Don't we feel good about ourselves when we have given all your energy to accomplish a task? We have given our all, but the total effort seems to energize us more to take on the next task, and the next. Conversely, when we do not give our all, subconsciously we know it, and even when the task is accomplished, we are not happy with ourselves. In the back of our mind we know we could have put forth a better effort.

By our anecdotal experiences we could offer good advise about living: If you want to be happy with yourself tomorrow, give all that is in you in accomplishing today's task. But do we do things only because they make us feel good about ourselves, and make us happy? The word of God allows us to dig deeper than the surface feel-good mentality, and anchor ourselves in His infallible wisdom.

Concerning our tasks under the sun, God tells us, *“Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with all thy might; for there is no work, nor device, nor knowledge, nor wisdom in Sheol,*

whither thou goest” (Ecclesiastes 9:10). God implores us to use “all” our “might” when we do anything. We should not approach our tasks nonchalantly, or half-throttle our energy in our work.

God offers us a sobering thought to motivate us to expend all. In telling us that there is no work, device, knowledge nor wisdom in the place we go to in death, he implies that the task before us today is where these attributes must be applied. There will be no “to do” lists, or inventing a tool to accomplish a task, or applying knowledge and wisdom so our work can be accomplished most efficiently in sheol. Work in this world only stays in this world. What a shame to go through life and not apply all our abilities to their fullest extent in our tasks upon the earth. Such opportunities to accomplish a work under the sun will not be ours in the world to come. So, do it now, and do it with everything you have in you.

God takes our focus deeper than mere life under the sun. Paul writes, *“whatsoever ye do, work heartily, as unto the Lord, and not unto men” (Colossians 3:23).* Doing something “heartily” literally

means “from the soul”. There should be passion in our work. The passion should be tempered with a proper understanding that we are doing each task “as unto the Lord”.

Doing are deeds in life rises above whether or not men are watching, or approving. Our focus is upon doing that which the Lord looks upon with favor. No half-hearted service is tolerated: *“In diligence not slothful; fervent in spirit, serving the Lord” (Romans 12:11).* Knowing that we have been bought from the slave master of sin, purified from our sins, and are looked upon by God as His special people, should charge our batteries to do the work of the Lord with boiling fervency (*Titus 2:14*).

Determine to do each task “with all your might” and each work demanded by the lord “heartily” When you are tempted to slack up, remember your opportunities to employ your abilities in work under the sun will end some day, and it is the Lord you are working for, not men. Thus focused, you should give it your all.
