In light of this survey William Donohue, the president of the Catholic League, noted "The three most dreaded words are thou shalt not....Notice they {those not claiming to be christian} are not {claiming to be} atheist, they are saying I don't want to be told what to do with my life."

Many bemoan the secularization of America and fear that our country will plummet into an almost anti-religious state likened to Europe's current condition. Yet, what should the Christian's approach be to such news?
