## God's Modernity

**B**urning buildings out of protest grabs attention. For many, the attention of destructive flames seems fitting for the passion that burns in their hearts to see justice administered. Over a decade ago, a Danish newspaper depicted Mohammad, the Muslim founder, in an unfavorable way. Muslims reacted by publicly protesting, burning buildings, and crying out for the incarceration and death of those responsible for the cartoon.

We in Western society may be able to understand public protesting, but burning and killing over a cartoon is hard for many to fathom. One may stick the cross of Christ in a bottle of urine and call it art. Christians may not like it, but our country founded upon the freedom of speech allows even the most unpopular speech to be expressed peacefully. A “Christian” erupting to kill the so-called artist would bring the wrath of our society and punishment of our government upon such a one. Even those who burn down clinics in the name of Christianity are brought to justice, not encouraged to burn more.

The problem with the Muslim world is that their doctrine allows and even encourages such

deadly retaliation in the face of Mohammad's enemies: “*Therefore strike off their heads, and strike off all the ends of their fingers. This shall they suffer; because they have resisted God and his apostle: and whosoever shall oppose God and his apostle, verily God will be severe in punishing him*” (Koran 8:12). Making a “*great slaughter*” among the non-Muslim believers was to continue until the enemy asked for “*a ransom*” or “*laid down its arms*” (Koran 47:4).

One glaring problem for the Muslims, who would like their religion to spread, is their “Holy Book” is mired in the seventh century. Moderates today may overlook the exhortation to kill unbelievers, but the so-called radicals can quote such death in their own Scripture and point to the very words of the Prophet whom they are commanded to follow.

The one true God of the Bible could have kept us in the teachings of His servant Moses. As true followers, we would today be executing adulterous couples (Leviticus 20:10) and stoning to death rebellious children (Deuteronomy 21:18-21). We would also be offering up animal sacrifice (Leviticus 1-9).

We can do so without burning buildings. No one can point to the gospel of Christ and set forth chapter and verse for us to kill our enemies. Christ established a religion that will bless man. Even those who do not follow Christ are blessed through Christians (Matthew 5:43-48, Ephesians 6:5-8).
