> Every Sunday, the first day of the week, we gather together to remember the Lord's death. We do so by partaking of the Lord's supper, comprised of unleavened bread and the fruit of the vine (I Corinthians 11:23-25). Assembling together to partake, "ye proclaim the Lord's death till He come" (I Corinthians 11:26).

Our worship unto God involves not only singing, and partaking of the Lord's supper on Sundays, but includes "praying" together (I Timothy 2:8, Acts Could you respond with the 12:5,12), and hearing the Word of God proclaimed (Acts 20:7). On Sundays, we also cheerfully give a portion of our money back to God which He has prospered us to have (I Corinthians 16:1-2; 2 Corinthians 9:7).

> One may read the Bible, sing, and pray privately in meaningful worship. They may even enjoy such activities in nature's outdoors. But the Parkview church exists in its location so that on Saturday's its members look forward to gathering with others to praise Jehovah "in the assembly of the saints."

> Parkview also exists to NURTURE. Our local church is a functioning spiritual body

Jesus Christ. Paul describes it this way, "we...speaking truth in love, may grow up in all things unto Him, who is the head, even Christ...unto the building up of itself in love' (Ephesians 4:15-16).

Parkview also exists to EVANGELIZE. Our head, Jessus Christ, left Heaven to come to earth to "seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10). We continue with this same passion by proclaiming the good news of salvation in Christ to others. Locally and world-wide, our church is focused on "making disciples of all nations, baptizing them into the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit..." (Matthew 28:19).
