- A. Characterizes the apostles' ministry in Christ (5:11-21)
 - 1. Prompted by reality of Lord's judgment (v. 11-13)
 - 2. Held together by the love of Christ (v. 14-21)
- B. Plea to not receive such grace in vain (6:1-7:1)
 - 1. The ministers' lives examples of total devotion to God (6:2-13).
 - 2. Separation from sin a demand of reconciliation (6:14-7:1)
