FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT - FAITHFULNESS LESSON 7

I. FAITHFULNESS DEFINED:

A. Greek noun PISTIS means TRUST.

B. Used in the New Testament as:

- 1. trust in God and his word (Mark 11:22).
- 2. the gospel of Christ or the body of truth called "the faith" (Acts 6:7, 14:22, Galatians 1:23, Jude 3, etc.)
- 3. the trust or firm persuasion that is produced in one toward Christ by the gospel (Acts 20:21, Rom. 10:17).
- 4. the trustworthy, loyal or faithful life demanded of the Christian (Titus 2:13, Rev. 2:13).

II. FAITHFULNESS IS A CHARACTERISTIC OF GOD.

A. A basis for our trust in Him (Rom. 3:3)

- 1. Gives us confidence in his promises (I Thess. 5:24, Heb. 10:23, 11:11).
- 2. Gives us confidence in forgiveness (I Jn.1:9).
- 3. Helps us endure persecution (I Cor. 10:13, I Pet. 4:19).

B. We can depend upon Jesus.

- 1. Faithful to God (Heb. 3:2,5)
- 2. Faithful High Priest (Heb. 2:17)
- 3. Faithful Witness (Rev. 1:5, 19:11)

C. God in Christ offers a trustworthy message; - can bank on it!

- 1. Christ came to world to save sinners (I Tim. 1:15).
- 2. Desire work of bishop desire a good work (I Tim. 3:1).
- 3. We should exercise our selves unto Godliness. (I Tim. 4:9)
- 4. Those claiming to believe in God must produce good works (Titus 3:8).

III. FAITHFULNESS MUST BE SEEN IN US AS WE LIVE BEFORE MEN.

A. Trustworthy to God in proclaiming the Gospel (2 Tim. 2:2).

1. An essential mark of God's steward (I Cor. 4:2).
