JOB: LESSON SIX

INTRODUCTION

In chapters 22-24, we observe the third round of Eliphaz's speeches with Job's response. Eliphaz continues to make his strong charges of Job's sinfulness (chapter 22), and Job's questions remain unanswered (chapters 23-24).

VI. ELIPHAZ'S THIRD SPEECH AND JOB'S REPLY (chapters 22-24).

- A. Eliphaz appeals to God's glory (22:1-4).
- B. Unsupported charges (22: 5-11)
- C. Insulting assumptions of concepts he thinks Job holds (22:12-14)
- D. Exhorts Job to confess his sin and return to God -Job will be blessed (22: 15-30).
- E. Job's reply (chapters 23-24)
 - 1. While God is just and will vindicate Job, he wonders why God cannot be found at this time (chapter 23).
 - 2. Job looks at the unrighteous conditions and wonders why God is silent (chapter 24).
