- 2. What is meant by Solomon describing the Shulammite woman as "terrible as an army with banners?
- 3. How does the Shulammite woman compare to Solomon's 60 queens and 80 concubines, and innurable maidens in waiting?
- 4. In 6:11-12, where does the Shulammite woman go, and what happens to her before she is aware of it?
- 5. How does the Shulammite woman respond to the daughters of Jerusalem's desire to look upon her?
- 6. What is the Shulammite woman doing before the daughters of Jerusalem that causes them to compliment her feet, thighs and hands in 7:1?
- 7. What was her "waist" like?
- 8. How does Solomon look upon her beginning in 7:6?
- 9. How does the Shulammite woman respond to love's desires of Solomon?
