## SONG OF SOLOMON – LESSON FOUR

## I. THE SHULAMMITE'S SECOND DREAM OF HER BELOVED – BUT HE HAS TURNED AWAY IN HER DREAM (5:2-6:3).

- A. The Shulammite woman dreams that her beloved comes asking her to open her door (v. 2)
  - 1. Shulammite woman replies that she is already taken off her garment and washed her feet for the night (v.3).
- B. When she does open the door he has turned away (v.4-6).
- C. The daughters of Jerusalem must promise that if they find the beloved, that they will tell him that the Shulammite woman is "sick from love" for him (v. 8).
- D. Daughters of Jerusalem wonder why the Shulammite's beloved is greater than another (v. 9)
  - 1. Shulammite woman describes ten-fold the physical greatness of her beloved (v. 10-16).
- E. Daughters of Jerusalem ask where her beloved has gone they would like to seek him with her (6:1).
  - 1. Shulammite woman replies with a yearning for him to come to her for they belong to each other (6:2-3)
