XVIII. PAUL IS IMPRISONED IN JERUSALEM (21:17-39).

- C. Jews of Asia stir up multitude by accusing Paul of defiling the Temple (21:27-30).
- D. Chief captain saves Paul from the beating of the multitude (21:31-36).
- E. Paul asks to speak to the people (21:37-39).
