### GENESIS – LESSON FIFTEEN

#### I. JACOB RETURNS TO CANAAN (Genesis 32-36)

- A. Jacob meets hosts of angels Place called Mahanaim (32:1-2).
- B. Jacob fearfully prepares to meet Esau (32:3-21).
  - 1. Jacob sends messengers to find favor with Esau (v.3-5).
  - 2. Messengers send report of Esau coming with 400 men (v.6).
  - 3. In fear, Jacob divides family and possessions into two companies and prays to God (v. 7-12).
  - 4. Jacob plans in sending distinctive droves of animals to appease Esau, and protect his children and their mothers (v. 13-21).
- C. Jacob wrestles all night with the angel of God Place called 'Penuel' (32:22-32).
  - 1. Jacob prevails against the angel to receive blessing.
  - 2. Jacob's Name changed to "Israel" "princely contender with God".
  - 3. The place is called "Penuel" "Face of God".
  - 4. The hollow of Jacob's thigh in sinew of hip touched by angel not to be eaten by children of Israel.
- D. Jacob meets peacefully with Esau (33:1-20).
  - 1. Esau departs in peace to Seir.
  - 2. Jacob goes in peace to city of Shechem.
- E. Jacob has troubles with Hamor and Shechem (34:1-31).
  - 1. Dinah sexually defiled by Shechem.
  - 2. Shechem asks Hamor, his father, to purchase Dinah to be his wife.
  - 3. Jacob's sons defise deceitful plan demanding all of males of city to be circumcised.
  - 4. While inhabitants are healing, Simeon and Levi kill them with the sword.
  - 5. Jacob confronts Simeon and Levi claiming their actions have made him and his family odious to the people in Canaan.
  - 6. Simeon and Levi justify their actions as avenging the honor of their sister. "Should he deal with our sister as with a harlot?".
- F. God renews His promise to Jacob at Bethel (35:1-15).
- G. Rachel dies in childbirth with Benjamin on the way to Ephrath (35:16-20).
- H. Ruben commits incest with Bilah, Jacob's concubine (35:21-22).
- I. List of Jacob's twelve sons (35:23-26).
- J. Isaac's death and burial (35:27-29).
- K. The generations of Esau (36:1-43).
  - 1. Esau's wives and children and their removal to Mt. Seir (v.1-8)
  - 2. Son's and grandsons of Esau as heads of tribes (v. 9-14)
  - 3 Chiefs or dukes of Esau (v.15-19).
  - 4. Sons of Seir the Horite (v.20-30).
  - 5. Kings of Edom (v. 31-39).
  - 6. Dukes or Chiefs of Esau listed along with their distinctive places (v.40-43).
