INTRODUCTION

Men's attempts at peace:

Epicurus: "Add not to his possessions, but take away from his desires." Human desires make life a battleground.

Kill emotion - peace is lost when you allow anyone the keys to your heart.

Stoics: Become indifferent toward every external thing which can be affected by forces and circumstances beyond one's control.

I. THE NEW TESTAMENT IS A BOOK OF PEACE

A. "EIRENE" - "Peace"

- 1. Occurs eighty-eight times. Found at least once in every book.
- 2. Most common in greetings: "Grace and peace" (Rom.1:7, I Cor. 1:3, Eph. 1:2, Rev. 1:4, etc.)

II. PEACE AND HEBREW "SHALOM"

- A. "Eirene" translates Hebrew word "shalom" in the LXX.
- B. "Shalom" "everything that makes for a man's highest good."
 - 1. Not just life without conflict, but a life enjoying all the good gifts and blessings of God. (Psm. 38:3, Gen. 43:27, Job 15:21)
 - 2. Serenity and tranquillity (Psm. 4:8)
 - 3. Human friendship (Jer. 20:10).

III. PEACE COME FROM GOD

- A. From the God of peace (Rom.15:13, 33; Phil.4:7, 9; IThess. 5:23, Heb. 13:20,21, 2 Cor. 13:11).
- B. From Jesus Christ (John 20:19, 21, 26; 14:27)
- C. Trust put into obedient action (Rom. 2:10).

IV. PEACE COMES FROM RIGHT RELATIONSHIPS IN ALL SPHERES OF LIFE.

A. Between man and God (Rom. 5:1, Col. 1:20)

B. Between man and man (Heb. 12:14, I Cor. 7:15)

- C. Between Jew and Gentile (Eph. 2:14-17).
- D. Between members of the church (Eph. 4:3, Col. 3:15).
