

HOSEA – LESSON SEVEN

- I. ISRAEL'S APOSTASY IN CONTRAST TO GOD'S FAITHFULNESS AND LOVE (Chapters 12-14)**
- A. Ephraim's unfaithfulness to God and consequent weakness contrasted with their forefather Jacob's devotion and strength with God (12:1-6).
 - B. Instead of being God's people, Ephraim has become a deceitful trafficker (*Canaan*) (12:7-8).
 - C. From the same God, who has shown Israel love and issued warnings, will issue judgment which will humble Israel (12:9-11).
 - D. Ephraim's ingratitude to God's leading and preserving him has provoked God to anger who will bring the consequences of sin upon Him (12:12-14).
 - E. Ephraim once standing tall in honor died in his worship of Baal (13:1-3).
 - F. The same Jehovah that blessed Israel in the wilderness will tear them as a wild beast in the wilderness (13:4-8).
 - G. Ephraim's destruction will come as a consequence of sin and their king will not be able to prevent it (13:9-12).
 - H. Through travail and sorrow Israel's deliverance as determined by God will come (13:13-14).
 - I. Once fruitful Ephraim will become a dry waste due to rebellion against God (13:15-16).
 - J. As Israel comes to true repentance God pardons and restores (14:1-9).
