I. GOD'S JUDGMENTS UPON THE NATIONS AND ISRAEL'S DELIVERANCE (Chapters 24-27).

- A. God's sovereignty expressed in judgments upon Jerusalem and all kings of the earth (24:1-23).
- B. God praised for taking away the reproach of His people (25:1-12).
- C. Plea for Trusting in Jehovah because the day of deliverance will come (26:1-21).
- D. God smites in judgment the enemies of his people – God chastises in judgment His people (27:1-13).
