

2 TIMOTHY: LESSON 7

II. PAUL'S PERSONAL REMARKS AND SALUTATIONS (4:6-22).

- A. Paul's assurance in the face of death (v. 6-8)
 - 1. Being offered as drink offering.
 - 2. Has fought – finished – kept.
 - 3. Assured of crown of righteousness from righteous judge.

- B. Paul's request for Timothy to come to Paul (v. 9-15).
 - 1. Demas has forsaken Paul – loved present world.
 - a. Crescens has gone to Galatia
 - b. Titus has gone to Dalmatia.
 - c. Only Luke is with Paul.
 - 2. Requests Timothy to bring:
 - a. Useful Mark
 - b. Cloak
 - c. Books and Parchments
 - 3. Timothy warned of evil deeds of Alexander the coppersmith.

- C. Paul's praise for his Lord (v. 16-18).
 - 1. The Lord stood by Paul.
 - 2. The Lord will deliver Paul into His heavenly kingdom.

- D. Paul's salutations and desire for the Lord and His grace to be with Timothy (v. 19-22).
