## The Self-Existing God

hen Moses asked God by what name he should give identifying the one who has sent him, God said, "I AM THAT I AM...thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, I AM hath sent me unto you" (Exodus 3:14). identifies himself God ETERNAL in that He is always present.
